A NOTE ON RESOURCES

This Appendix will help you connect an abused senior with community resources that may assist with his/her immediate needs.

There is not one central organization in our province that can support all the needs of older adult affected by elder abuse. Thus it may be necessary to assist a senior in contacting a variety of organizations to get a range of services from counselling to emergency shelter.

Once a senior has indicated that he/she would like to contact a specific community resource, ask if he/she would like your assistance. Often a referral from a professional service provider will enable a senior to obtain assistance more quickly.

To assist a senior to connect with their regional health authority (for access to a social worker, home support services, etc.), see Appendix 2.

Information and Referral Line for Elder Abuse and other Seniors' Issues
